

In Brief News & Views from the World of Harpsichords...

Issue #23 Spring 1993

- Geoffrey Lancaster has just headed to Europe for an all-Haydn festival near Munich (including a recording project for Sony Classics) and will then have several performances in North America with Toronto's "*Tafelmusik*". Earlier in the year we packed his D. Jacques Way fortepiano in our flightcase for its safe trip to Perth for his monthlong guest artist residency at UWA...
- March saw me on special assignment for the Music Department of the University of Hong Kong, where I had to restore five instruments to playing order. Fortuitously, I was also able to rescue one of Ralph Kirkpatrick's harpsichords from the 1960s in City Hall, just in time for the 400 people attracted to Colin Tilney's performance there...
- Much smaller but no less appreciative audiences greeted Colin Tilney in Australia, including those at his sole Sydney recital in our shop (recorded for future broadcast by ABC Fine Music) and his clavichord recital at the Melbourne Organ & Harpsichord Festival. One hopes for continued early keyboard interest at the Festival after this year's bumper effort. The curious crammed Alastair McAllister's harpsichord workshop for one of the most popular non-concert events in Festival memory...
- You might have seen Ray Harvey as continuo harpsichordist with French baroque specialist Marc Minkowski conducting the Australian Chamber Orchestra on tour in June. Minkowski's Parisian orchestra "Les Musiciens du Louvre", well known through their fine Erato recordings, now proudly have their own harpsichord—a 1992

Flemish Single by Marc Ducornet. Nine of their CD releases over the years use various keyboard instruments from our Paris shop—our complete discography lists full details of all recordings made on D. Jacques Way & Marc Ducornet or Zuckermann instruments back to 1965...

- That's Showbiz! Zuckermann instruments can be heard on the soundtrack for Disney's "Beauty & the Beast", recorded in New York, and also in the new French release starring Gerard Depardieu as the aged Marin Marais, reminiscing of his youth spent learning viol with Sainte-Colombe and seducing his teacher's daughters in "Tous les matins du monde"...
- Overseas early music festivals like Boston and Brugges have quite a following in Australia, but lesser known is the one that runs over July weekends in the mediaeval town of Beaune, centre of the Bourgogne district in the south of France. This was its eleventh year, and the program included three concert-version operas with musical direction by Paul MacCreesh, Marc Minkowski and Christophe Rousset, and eleven other concerts with names like Ton Koopman, Sigiswald Kuijken and Jordi Savall directing their own famous groups...
- In June, ABC Fine Music broadcast our Italian harpsichord live from the Opera House for the "His Majestys Sagbutts & Cornetts" Musica Viva concert. "Les Arts Florissants", another group which frequently uses DJW & MD instruments in Europe, will be touring shortly after appearances in Korea and China... CB

For Harpsichord Owners...

- More stocks have arrived of the new black celcon plectra which the Americans remain keen on. It slices easier than delrin with the voicing knife, and doesn't work harden over time. While it is slightly thicker, some people reported a little trouble in getting it to wedge firmly into tongues which had been used for delrin. This could be a problem if the delrin was jammed in too tightly, enlarging the mortise from side to side. The answer is to lightly crimp the end of the celcon quill to flatten it. We continue to stock white delrin plectra, which for the sake of consistency you should use for odd replacements, and only use the new celcon for complete revoicing jobs. Both come in packets of approximately 110 for \$11 plus p&p.
- Voice both delrin and celcon in a triangular section for maximum durability, keeping the full thickness in

a central ridge for strength and just tapering the corners. Try to avoid the fizz of needle-like quills by keeping the plectra full width for a strong fundamental, and don't forget the final bevel cut at the tip to help the quill settle below the string. A diagram showing the correct method is yours for the asking.
